8.4 Respecting Identity

Companions must:

- Honour cultural, spiritual, and personal identity
- Respect life history and experiences
- Support autonomy and choice

8.5 Maintaining Boundaries

Companions must **not**:

- Form personal or romantic relationships
- Share personal contact details
- Provide financial support
- Accept inappropriate gifts
- Engage in physical affection beyond safe reassurance
- Create emotional dependency

8.6 Safeguarding Awareness

Relationship-centred care must identify:

- Emotional distress
- Isolation
- Neglect
- Domestic abuse
- Radicalisation
- Exploitation

Concerns must be reported immediately.

9. Relationship-Centred Care in Different Settings

9.1 Private Homes

- Respect the home environment
- Maintain emotional presence
- Avoid over-familiarity

9.2 Community Settings

- Encourage safe social participation
- Maintain public professionalism

9.3 Digital Environments

- Support digital connection safely
- Avoid personal digital contact

9.4 Overnight Companionship

- Maintain boundaries
- Provide emotional reassurance
- Ensure safe sleeping arrangements

9.5 Holiday Companionship

- Maintain professionalism during travel
- Support emotional wellbeing
- Avoid informal behaviour that compromises boundaries

10. Supporting Healthy Relationships

Companions must:

- Avoid creating dependency
- Promote confidence
- Support meaningful engagement
- Maintain emotional balance

11. Documentation & Record Keeping

Companions must document:

- Emotional wellbeing observations

- Relational engagement activities
- Safeguarding concerns
- Changes in mood or behaviour

Records must be stored securely.

12. Training Requirements

Staff must receive training in:

- Relationship-centred care
- Emotional intelligence
- Cultural competence
- Safeguarding
- Trauma-informed practice
- Professional boundaries
