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1. Policy Introduction

Trusted Companionship, the trading name of AI Auto-Tech Ltd, is committed to protecting service users, companions, volunteers, and staff from infection risks. Infection prevention and control (IPC) is essential in companionship work, where staff support vulnerable adults, disabled individuals, and children in private homes, community settings, and environments with varying hygiene standards.

3. Policy Statement

Trusted Companionship ensures that all companions follow infection prevention and control procedures to protect themselves and service users. Companions must:

- Maintain personal hygiene
- Use PPE appropriately

- Follow handwashing protocols
- Report infection risks immediately
- Avoid unsafe environments
- Document concerns accurately

Companions must **not**:

- Administer medication
- Provide clinical wound care
- Use medical equipment
- Ignore signs of infection
- Enter environments that pose serious infection risks

4. Purpose

- Reduce infection risks for service users and staff
- Provide clear IPC procedures
- Strengthen safeguarding through hygiene awareness
- Ensure compliance with health and safety legislation
- Promote safe companionship practice
- Support staff confidence and competence

7. Definitions

Infection: The invasion and multiplication of microorganisms that cause illness.

Infection Control: Measures taken to prevent and manage infection risks.

PPE: Personal Protective Equipment such as gloves, masks, and aprons.

Cross-Contamination: Transfer of harmful microorganisms from one person or surface to another.

8. Companion Responsibilities

8.1 Personal Hygiene

Companions must:

- Maintain clean clothing
- Keep nails short and clean
- Avoid wearing jewellery that may harbour bacteria
- Use deodorant and maintain personal cleanliness

8.2 Hand Hygiene

Companions must:

- Wash hands before and after each visit
- Wash hands after using the toilet
- Wash hands after coughing or sneezing
- Use hand sanitiser when soap and water are unavailable

8.3 Use of PPE

Companions must:

- Wear gloves when appropriate
- Wear masks when required
- Dispose of PPE safely
- Avoid reusing disposable PPE

8.4 Environmental Awareness

Companions must:

- Identify hygiene risks
- Avoid unsafe environments
- Report concerns immediately
- Encourage safe practices sensitively

8.5 Professional Boundaries

Companions must **not**:

- Provide clinical care
- Clean wounds
- Administer medication
- Handle bodily fluids beyond basic first aid
- Use medical equipment

9. Recognising Infection Risks

Risks may include:

- Poor home hygiene
- Contaminated surfaces
- Presence of pests
- Unmanaged wounds
- Respiratory symptoms
- Gastrointestinal symptoms
- Unsafe food storage
- Overcrowded environments
- Lack of ventilation

Companions must report risks immediately.

10. Infection Control in Different Settings

10.1 Private Homes

- Respect the home environment
- Encourage safe hygiene practices

- Avoid touching personal items unnecessarily

10.2 Overnight Companionship

- Maintain personal hygiene
- Keep PPE accessible
- Avoid sharing bedding or personal items

10.3 Holiday Companionship

- Follow local health guidelines
- Maintain hygiene during travel
- Avoid unsafe food or water sources

10.4 Transport

- Keep vehicle interiors clean
- Use sanitiser after touching public surfaces

11. Safeguarding Considerations

Infection risks may indicate:

- Neglect
- Cognitive decline
- Domestic abuse
- Environmental hazards
- Self-neglect

Companions must escalate concerns immediately.

12. Reporting Infection Concerns

Companions must:

- Inform the office immediately
- Document concerns factually
- Report safeguarding risks
- Cooperate with external agencies if required

13. Training Requirements

Staff must receive training in:

- Infection prevention
- Hand hygiene
- PPE use
- Safeguarding
- Lone-working safety
- Environmental risk assessment

14. Documentation & Record Keeping

Records must include:

- Infection concerns
- Actions taken
- Safeguarding escalations
- Communication with external agencies

Records must be stored securely.
